THE Gay Solidarity Group (GSG) began as a small representative group of homosexual women and men to organize "International Gay Solidarity Day" in Sydney. Our decision to hold a mardi Gras was greeted with enthusiasm through-

out cities against the violent police bashings and arrests in Sydney.

Sydney homosexuals were not intimidated by the police attacks. We were angry, and the messages of support which reached us from throughout Australia and

led us to campaign for the dropping of the charges.

The GSG collective consists mainly of people who have been active in the anti-sexist and homosexual rights movement for several years. We believe the liberation of homosexuals can only be achieved

through pride and sol-
